We are IN! An open house and ribbon cutting were held for the public on December 4th and students moved in the following week. We are all so excited to have this brand-new dorm for our students and it wouldn't have been possible without the support of our communities. Lloyd Hall will be able to hold 126 students both female and male. Thompson Hall dormitory is currently under renovation as well which holds male students. Thompson will see upgrades in the HVAC system, bathrooms, flooring, doors, and common area upgrades. It is an exciting time to be on campus!













The E-Club, which is made up of community members and employees of ECC, has a primary mission to support our student-athletes through scholarships. This year, they were able to reach their endowed scholarship goal of \$100,000.00. The club works closely with ECC Athletic Director, Nate Forsyth when awarding the E-Club Scholarships. Scholarships for our athletes make a tremendous impact on our student-athletes. While most students have time to work part-time (on or off campus), our athletes don't have the luxury of a lot of free time. Between practices, games, and community involvement their time is limited. This year our students have been dedicated in the classroom as well as their sport of choice. We recently published that 115 ECC Athletes obtained Academic All-Region Students (2.5 grade point average) and 67 of those student-athletes made the 1st team (3.5 and above grade point average). The athletic scholarships make a difference.

The E-Club has 2 fundraisers during the year. The Wild Game Feed and the July 4th Golf Tournament. This year's Wild Game Feed will be held on March 29th at The Elks Club. The committee has done this event for 59 years, it runs like a well-oiled machine. There are auction items, raffles, a variety of foods, and many people in attendance to support the event. The annual Golf Tournament will be held at Highland Golf Club on or around the 4th of July. More details will be provided as it gets closer.

The E-Club offers different levels of support: Panther Club \$50, Century Club \$100 (1 Paw Pass into athletic games), Purple Club \$250 (2 Paw Passes), Silver Club \$500 (3 passes), Gold Club \$1,000 (4 passes) and Platinum \$2,500 (6 passes). They sell Gym Banners with your business name & logo or family name - \$200 1st year and \$100 annual renewal. All proceeds are invested in the E-Club Athletic Endowment Scholarship. Thank you to all that are a part of the E-Club and the impact you are providing to our student-athletes.
